

During the days of the Iron Curtain, Albania was a fiercely atheistic country firmly in the grip of communism. As part of its clampdown on religion, various individuals were assigned to scan incoming radio transmissions for the purpose of jamming those stations that were beaming in Christian programming. One of those 'scanners' was a man named Albert. Perchance, or better yet, providentially, he discovered a signal carrying a Words of Hope broadcast. Because he liked what he heard, however, he didn't report his find. Instead, he listened whenever he could. Today Albert is not only a Christian; he is also the broadcaster for Words of Hope in the Albanian language.



In Kashmir, a Muslim region of northern India with borders disputed by Pakistan, Christian converts were being baptized. Someone present recorded the event but then unwisely posted it on You-Tube. Soon, everyone on the video, along with their families and a Words of Hope broadcasting team were threatened and had to flee for their lives.

Iran is arguably one of the most oppressive countries in the world—especially for Christians. With secret police everywhere, believers find it difficult to talk about Jesus even with their neighbors because it is hard for them to know who is and who isn't an informant. Arrest and detention are common. One woman, a medical doctor, heard the Gospel over the radio and became a Christian. After arranging for a Bible to be smuggled to her via a bus driver, she was caught and then forced to call and invite some of her Christian contacts to her home. No one came because all sensed a trap, but the woman has never been heard from again.

In Africa, Niger ranks as one of the poorest countries of the world. Many parts are remote and isolated—some virtually inaccessible. Thankfully, villagers receive wind-up radios and hear about Jesus.

These stories were told at a recent Words of Hope board meeting for a reason. The world is vast; much of it is hostile to the Gospel. How then can the masses be reached? Who will proclaim the Good News when nations declare themselves to be closed? Thankfully, there is a voice that continues to penetrate both borders and hearts—Words of Hope. Please continue to support it. In a day and age of increased giving for local causes which are good, don't forget the world.

On their literature, Words of Hope has a slogan that goes like this: *Good News. No Boundaries.* That pretty much says it all. The thing they do best is "Reaching the 'hard places' for Jesus Christ."
